
Fund performance and benchmark history²

ProShares UltraShort MSCI Japan seeks a return that is -2x the return of its index (target) for a single day, as measured from one NAV calculation to the next. Due to the compounding of daily returns, holding periods of greater than one day can result in returns that are significantly different than the target return and ProShares' returns over periods other than one day will likely differ in amount and possibly direction from the target return for the same period. These effects may be more pronounced in funds with larger or inverse multiples and in funds with volatile benchmarks. Investors should monitor their holdings as frequently as daily. Daily performance of EWV vs. benchmark during 40 2021³




Daily change in equivalent benchmark return


