- · Overweighting a market segment without additional cash


#### Fund performance and benchmark history<sup>2</sup>

ProShares Ultra MSCI Brazil Capped seeks a return that is 2x the return of its index (target) for a single day, as measured from one NAV calculation to the next. Due to the compounding of daily returns, holding periods of greater than one day can result in returns that are significantly different than the target return and ProShares' returns over periods other than one day will likely differ in amount and possibly direction from the target return for the same period. These effects may be more pronounced in funds with larger or inverse multiples and in funds with volatile benchmarks. Investors should monitor their holdings as frequently as daily. ### Daily performance of UBR vs. benchmark during 40 2021<sup>3</sup>




Correlation 4= 0.99 Beta 5 = 2.00



The higher the volatility, the more an index's returns fluctuate over time. <sup>7</sup>Sum of weightings may not equal 100% due to rounding.
